Kindergarten and New Student Parent REMINDERS!

State of Kansas requires immunization records on all new students and first time entry students prior to first day of school (including Pre-K and Kindergarten).

State of Kansas also requires a Health Assessment Form completed by your doctor for all first time entry students prior to first day of school.

Enrollment Reminders

At the time of enrollment, take a copy of your child's immunization records to the school. Must be done prior to the first day of school.

At the time of enrollment, take a copy of your child's health assessment form to the school. Must be done prior to the first day of school.

How do you know, if your student is current, and if the school has what they need?

Call you doctor to see if your child meets immunizations requirements for their age.
Call the school nurse to see if they have received your immunization and health assessment records.

Immunization Requirements for the 2015 - 2016 School Year

K.A.R. 28-1-20 defines immunizations required for any individual who attends school or a childcare program operated by a school. There are changes in requirements for immunizations for the upcoming school year. Please carefully review the requirements below. The usual number of doses required are listed; however there are exceptional circumstances that could alter the number of doses a child needs. If you have questions about your child's immunization status, contact your child's primary care provider or local health department. Proof of receiving the immunizations must be provided to the school prior to attending the first day of school.

Early Childhood Program Operated by a School Ages 4 Years and Under

Vaccine	Requirement
DTaP/DT (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis)	4 doses
IPV (polio)	3 doses
MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)	1 dose
Varicella (chickenpox)	1 dose*
Hepatitis A	2 doses
Hepatitis B	3 doses
Hib (haemophilus influenza type B)	4 doses**
Prevnar (pneumococcal conjugate)	4 doses**

Grades 7 - 12	
Vaccine	Requirement
Tdap	1 dose~
IPV (polio)	4 doses ***
MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)	2 doses
Varicella (chickenpox)	2 doses*
Hepatitis B	3 doses

Additional ACIP Recommended Vaccines NOT REQUIRED for School Entry

- Influenza (flu) vaccine annually for everyone 6 months of age and older
- HPV (Human Papillomavirus) vaccine for females and males at 11-12 years of age
- Meningococcal (meningitis) vaccine at 11 12 years of age, with a booster at 16 years of age

Notes

- Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine is not required if child has had chickenpox disease and disease is documented by a physician signature.
 Without a physician signature, vaccine is required even if you believe child has had chickenpox disease.
- Total doses needed is dependent upon age of child when doses were received.
- *** All students in grades K 4, all new students and students currently completing the polia series must have 6 months between the last 2 doses of polio vaccine, and one dose must be after the 4th birthday.
 - All 7th 12th graders are required to have one dose of Tdap regardless of the interval since the last dose of DTaP (diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis) or Td (tetanus/diphtheria).

Fifth Grade Service Learning Project


The fifth grade classes finished reading *Maniac Magee* in their English Language Arts class. One of the themes discussed throughout the novel is homelessness.
