MPS Art Class has been very busy

Kindergarten has been learning about lines and how to draw stars. We read the book "How to Catch a Star" by Oliver Jeffers. The students talked about how the main character never gave up.

MGS Students Earn Emporia Trip for William Allen White Celebration!

On October 5th, fifteen of our MGS students will be headed to Emporia to attend the 66th Annual William Allen White Awards Celebration and Ceremony. The students will have a sleepover at the Emporia Recreation Center where they will have read-ins with the 2018 visiting authors. In addition, the students will visit the William Allen White house and tour Emporia State University. The William Allen White house was home to progressive Pulitzer Prize winning journalist William Allen White from 1899 until his death in 1944.

The selected MGS students worked very hard this past summer to qualify for this trip. The requirement was to read at least eight books from a list of books that have received the William Allen White award. The students then had to choose their favorite book of those eight and do a presentation on the book at the Mulvane Public Library in front of teachers, family and friends.

Our Title 1 teacher, Mrs. Alicia King, wrote a grant to the Mulvane Education Foundation last year to ask for help in funding this amazing opportunity for students to participate in the William Allen White celebration in Emporia, KS. We are excited to announce that this grant was awarded by MEF and will cover the expenses of this trip! Mrs. Katie Entwisle, the Librarian for MGS and MMS, is the organizer for this activity and trip. She has enjoyed taking students to Emporia for this celebration for the past three years.

The festivities will conclude with an Awards Ceremony, at which time student representatives will present the award winning authors with their White Award Medals. The ceremony will include speeches from the authors. What an exciting time for our students to be able to meet and listen to some of the authors of the books they read over the summer!

5th Grade Teacher Wins \$450 CUA Grant!

One of our 5th Grade Math and Science teachers, Katherine Lien, was the recipient of a \$450 grant from the Credit Union of America for a project entitled "Increasing Academic Proficiency with a Flipped Classroom." With the awarded funds, Mrs. Lien has purchased an Elmo Visual Presenter that will allow her to record videos, visual and written demonstrations of mathematic concepts for the students to be able to view during class instruction. Additionally, the students will have access to these videos while at home to aid in successful homework completion. This technology will free up the teacher to monitor the classroom for both behavioral needs and academic deficits in students that may otherwise be missed during a traditional classroom lecture. Mrs. Lien's goal with this "Flipped Classroom" technology, and rapidly growing teaching style, is that the students will increase their academic success by having access to a wide-range of learning modalities.




MGS 4th Graders Create Mega Creatures!



They have thoroughly discussed different animal adaptations and how these features help the animal to thrive in their ecosystem. The students wanted to take it one step further; they are creating a Mega Creature!


Each mega creature is a creation formed by combining different animal adaptations from animals inside a specific ecosystem. The students are able to pick which ecosystem they would like, as well as, which animal adaptations they would like to combine to create their Mega Creature. The students will draw and name their mega creature inside their ecosystem. They will then describe the reasons why they chose different adaptations and how those features will help their animal succeed in their environment.
