A note from the school nurse:

Illnesses: We have been seeing many illnesses throughout our district including, respiratory infections, stomach viruses, strep throat and Influenza A. It is important to keep your children home when they are not feeling well to reduce the spread of illnesses. Per school policy students must be free from vomiting/diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school. Students should also be "fever free" for 24 hours without the aid of medication. A fever is considered anything over 100.0 degrees. Always remembering to cover coughs and proper hand washing is the best way to reduce the spread of infection.

REMINDERS:

Absences: Please remember to call the office when students are late or absent. In accordance with board policy, notes from appointments or memorials from funerals are needed to exempt students from making up time after school. Makeup time will be assigned when students have missed over 49 hours of school without notes and/or memorial.
