Outside Competition: The Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSHSAA) has very specific rules concerning students who participate in sports away from school. If your student is planning to participate in an outside team, it is important that the coaches and students follow KSHSAA rules to stay eligible for interschool athletics.

"From the first Tuesday following Labor Day through the last Friday preceding Memorial Day, no more than three basketball players, four volleyball players, from the same school squad may practice or participate together on the same outside team. Participation by more than three squad members on the same team shall make them ineligible for the remainder of the school year."
