## MMS Earns KAMSA Top Awards: Middle School of the Year Finalist & High Performing School

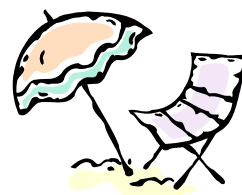

**Dress Code:** Warm weather is here. Please refer to the dress code section in the student agenda. **Outside Competition:** If your student is planning to participate on an outside team, it is important that the coaches and students follow KSHSAA rules to stay eligible for interschool athletics: *“From the first Tuesday following Labor Day through the last Friday preceding Memorial Day, no more than three players (Basketball) four players (Volleyball) from the same school squad may practice or participate together on the same outside team. Participation by more than three squad members on the same team shall make them ineligible for the school year.”*
