Sportsmanship is good citizenship in action!

As a member of the Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSHSAA) we would like to remind spectators and participants to adhere to the policies and rules of good sportsmanship.

ALL ACTIONS are to be FOR, NOT AGAINST; POSITIVE, NOT NEGATIVE or DISRESPECTFUL!

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: SPORTSMANSHIP is a general way of thinking and behaving. The following sportsmanship policy items are listed below for clarification:

- a. Be courteous to all. (participants, coaches, officials, staff and fans)
- b. Know the rules, abide by and respect the official's decisions.
- c. Win with character and lose with dignity.
- d. Display appreciation for good performance regardless of the team.
- e. Exercise self-control and reflect positively upon yourself, team and school.
- f. Permit only positive sportsmanlike behavior to reflect on your school or its activities.

Winter Sports Begin Soon

Please note the following if your 7th or 8th grader is interested in participating in basketball or wrestling at MMS:

All student athletes must have a KSHSAA physical and concussion form completed and turned into the office by Nov. 7 in order to participate in any winter sport. Please see the school website for a copy of the form or stop by the office to pick one up.

The Winter Sports Parents Meeting will be Monday, Nov.6 at 6:00 PM in the main gym. Coaches will be available to meet with parents and answer any questions at that time.

Basketball (for both boys and girls teams) will have tryouts during the following dates:

Wrestling practice will begin January 3. Any interested student is welcome to come to the first few practices to see if the sport is a fit for him or her.
