Shuttle Fees

The Mulvane School District is one of only two districts in the state that offer a shuttle service. Due to current budget cuts sustained, the district has elected to introduce a shuttle fee to those families that utilize the shuttle in order to be able to afford to keep providing this vital service.

All families that have students that ride the shuttle buses will be required to purchase a shuttle pass for their child or children according to the fee structure illustrated.

Families that have students that ride solely in the morning or afternoon will be able to purchase a bus pass for each child accordingly.

Families with students that ride in both the morning and afternoon will be able to purchase a multi-pass for each child. Families with students that only ride every once in a while will also be able to purchase this pass.

Families that have four or more students that ride the shuttle both morning and afternoon will be able to purchase a one time family pass good for the whole family.

Students that are assigned to a route bus and ride the shuttle from the high school to the route buses in the afternoon will not be required to purchase a shuttle pass.

Shuttle fees will be collected at enrollment by the school secretary and each family will be handed their shuttle passes at that time. All fees will be required to be paid by September 1st. Students will be given several free replacement passes upon the loss of a pass, then be charged for passes after those have been lost. Students without a pass will be allowed on the shuttle and parents will be contacted as soon as possible to arrange payment. There will be NO refunds of this fee for any reason.

Free developmental screening is offered each month by the USD 263 Special Education Office.

The screenings are for preschool children who might have potential learning problems or identify children who possess average or above average developmental skills as potential peer models. To schedule an appointment call the USD 263 Special Education Office at 777-0256.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHING

To substitute for the district there are two types of licenses: **Standard Substitute License** - You must hold a degree and have completed a teacher preparation program in order to qualify. **Emergency Substitute License** - For individuals who have completed a minimum of 60 semester credit hours from a regionally accredited college or university. The application fee this year will be \$39.00. First time applicants can access the application at: www.ksde.org or pick up the application at the District Office @ 628 E. Mulyane St.

SITE COUNCIL

The purpose of the school site council is to advise the school on such matters as student learning, education programs, school improvement planning, and accreditation issues. The site council also plays an advocacy role for the school regarding the same issues. Specifically, the purpose is to:

- Provide advice and counsel to the school in developing, implementing, and evaluating school performance goals and objectives.
- Provide ongoing support for the students and staff of the school.

ACTIVITY PASSES

Activity passes for the school year are available at MHS and MMS. Prices are:

Family Pass \$75.00, Individual Pass \$40.00, Sr. Citizen Pass \$20.00

SCHOOL PHYSICALS

MMS & MHS Students participating in school sports must have a physical signed by a doctor on file in the Athletic Director's office. A student cannot practice or try out without one. Forms are available in the District Office @ 628 E. Mulvane St.



KINDERGARTEN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Students entering Kindergarten must be 5 on or before August 31, 2009. Kindergarten students need to bring a copy of their birth certificate, their completed physical exam, and their immunization records.

The completed immunization record must include immunizations of at least:

- Diphtheria tetanus, Pertissis (DTaP): Five doses required
- Four doses acceptable if dose 4 given on or after the 4th birthday. Booster dose of Tdap required at age 11
- Poliomyelitis (IPV/OPV): Four doses required. Three doses acceptable if dose 3 given on or after the 4th birthday
- Two MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
- Hep B (Hepatitis B): Three doses required through grade 9
- Varicella (Chicken Pox): Two doses required for Kindergarden; one dose required grades 1-9 unless history of Varicella disease documented by a licensed physician

Parents may call school nurse, Sue Heersche, at 777-0151 for answers to specific questions or to obtain additional information concerning health questions.

Students already in attendance in USD 263 who need additional immunizations, such as a 10-year Tetanus/Diphtheria (Td) booster will also be excluded from school if proof of immunization is not provided to the school by the last day of the month in which the immunization is due. Parent(s) and/or guardian(s) will have received advanced notice of the due date through a previously mailed letter. Please contact Sue Heersche concerning health questions at 777-0151 or 777-1183.

T.A.P.E. (Teachers and Parents for Education)

The purpose of this group is to allow Principals, Teachers, and Parents to provide help, encouragement, and support for each other. This group helps students K through 5 to have the best school experience possible.

T.A.P.E. also serves the community with several activities. The list of activities follows: Scholastic Book Fairs, Reindeer Lane Gift Shop, food for teachers during conferences, raising funds for two different schools to help purchase equipment, supporting RC parties, teacher appreciation gifts, coordinating General Mills Box Top Program, and publishing a school directory and yearbook.

Our district's PAT program serves Mulvane children and their parents, because children are born to learn and parents are their child's best first teachers!

KIDCARE CONNECTION

Kid Care Connection is a state licensed child care service for school-age children - ages 5-12. Our mission is to provide quality and convenient childcare to your school-age children at a competitive value.

The fee for service is based on weekly contracts. Our license stipulates the number of children we can care for based on the size of the space, the site director's qualifications and staff to child ratio. Consequently, we do not allow drop ins without prior arrangements to ensure license compliance. Our tuition schedule is as follows:

City Utility Bills: Payment is due by the 5th of each month in order to avoid the late penalty. Bills paid after the 5th are subject to a 5% penalty. Shut-off for non-payment is 1:00 p.m. the 20th of each month. Please attach your utility bill stub to your payment to insure you receive proper credit to your bill. For after hours utility service, please call the Mulvane Police Dept. Dispatcher at 777-4262.

Utility Rates: Water rates: \$9.00 for the first 2,000 gallons, \$4.70 per 1,000 gallons thereafter. Sewer rates: \$16.75 customer charge, \$4.15 per 1,000 gallons, average sewer charge based on water usage during Dec., Jan., & Feb. Electric rates: \$5.45 customer charge, \$.0686 per kw, summer rates are from June thru Sept., first 500 kw are based on \$.0686 per kw and \$.0786 thereafter.

A fuel adjustment fee is included in the electric charge which changes monthly according to what the consumer fee is for purchasing electricity. A 5% incremental charge is included on the electric, water and sewer portions of the utility bill.

Stormwater Pollution Control: What goes into the street and storm sewer goes into a stream or river. Use pesticides and fertilizers on your lawn sparingly. Repair auto leaks. Sweep up yard debris. Clean up after your pet. Dispose of household hazardous waste (antifreeze, oil, paint, etc.) and batteries properly. Sedgwick county offers several locations in which to dispose of household hazardous waste. Call 660-7464 for more information.

Dogs & Cats - Licensing & Running At Large: All dogs and cats in the City must be vaccinated and licensed. Licenses can be purchased at the Mulvane Police Dept. at 211 N. 2nd. City ordinance limits the total number of pets per house to three (3). All dogs must be kept on a leash or in a fenced enclosure. Please clean up after your pet in city parks and other public places.
