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Shuttle Fees

The Mulvane School District is one of only two districts in the state that offer a shuttle service. The shuttle fee introduced last school year will continue this school year.

All families that have students that ride the shuttle buses will be required to purchase a shuttle pass for their child or children according to the fee structure illustrated.

Families that have students that ride solely in the morning or afternoon will be able to purchase a bus pass for each child accordingly.

Families with students that ride in both the morning and afternoon will be able to purchase a multi-pass for each child. Families with students that only ride every once in a while will also be able to purchase this pass.

Families that have four or more students that ride the shuttle both morning and afternoon will be able to purchase a one time pass good for the whole family.

Students that assigned to a route bus and ride the shuttle from the high school to the route buses in the afternoon will not be required to purchase a shuttle pass.

Shuttle fees will be collected at enrollment by the transportation department representative at the transportation table and each family will be handed their shuttle passes within the first few weeks of school. All fees will be required to be paid by September 1st. Students will be given several free replacement passes upon the loss of a pass, then be charged for passes after those have been lost. Students without a pass will be allowed on the shuttle and parents will be contacted as soon as possible to arrange payment. There will be NO refunds of shuttle feels for any reason.

KINDERGARTEN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Students entering Kindergarten must be 5 on or before August 31, 2010. Kindergarten students need to bring a copy of their birth certificate, their completed physical exam, and their immunization records.

The completed immunization record must include immunizations of at least:

- Diphtheria tetanus, Pertissis (DTaP): Five doses required
- Four doses acceptable if dose 4 given on or after the 4th birthday. Booster dose of Tdap required at age 11
- Poliomyelitis (IPV/OPV): Four doses required. Three doses acceptable if dose 3 given on or after the 4th birthday
- Two MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)
- Hep B (Hepatitis B): Three doses required through grade 9
- Varicella (Chicken Pox): Two doses required for Kindergarden; one dose required grades 1-9 unless history of Varicella disease documented by a licensed physician

Parents may call school nurse, Sue Heersche, at 777-0151 for answers to specific questions or to obtain additional information concerning health questions.

Students already in attendance in USD 263 who need additional immunizations, such as a 10-year Tetanus/Diphtheria (Td) booster will also be excluded from school if proof of immunization is not provided to the school by the last day of the month in which the immunization is due. Parent(s) and/or guardian(s) will have received advanced notice of the due date through a previously mailed letter. Please contact Sue Heersche concerning health questions at 777-0151 or 777-1183.

KIDCARE CONNECTIONS

Kid Care Connection is a state licensed child care service for school-age children - ages 5-12. Our mission is to provide quality and convenient childcare to your school-age children at a competitive value.

Our license stipulates the number of children we can care for based on the size of the space, the site director's qualifications, and staff to child ratio.
