Shuttle Fees

The Mulvane School District is one of only two districts in the state that offer a shuttle service. The shuttle fee will continue this school year.

All families that have students that ride the shuttle buses will be required to purchase a shuttle pass for their child or children according to the fee structure illustrated.

Families that have students that ride solely in the morning or afternoon will be able to purchase a bus pass for each child accordingly.

Families with students that ride in both the morning and afternoon will be able to purchase a multi-pass for each child. Families with students that only ride every once in a while will also be able to purchase this pass.

Families that have four or more students that ride the shuttle both morning and afternoon will be able to purchase a one time pass good for the whole family.

Students that are assigned to a route bus and ride the shuttle from the high school to the route buses in the afternoon will not be required to purchase a shuttle pass.

Shuttle fees will be collected at enrollment by the transportation department representative at the transportation table and each family will be handed their shuttle passes within the first few weeks of school. All fees will be required to be paid by September 1st. Students will be given several free replacement passes upon the loss of a pass, then be charged for passes after those have been lost. Students without a pass will be allowed on the shuttle and parents will be contacted as soon as possible to arrange payment. There will be NO refunds of shuttle fees for any reason.

REDUCED PRICE & FREE SCHOOL MEALS ARE AVAILABLE AT MULVANE USD #263

Mulvane USD #263 participates in the Child Nutrition Program administered by the Kansas State Department of Education. Application forms are available at each school building and the district office. During these tough economic times, we encourage you to fill out an application to see if your student qualifies for this program. All applications are treated confidentially. Mulvane USD #263 wants to give each student the opportunity to have a nutritious breakfast and/or lunch.

IMMUNIZATION NOTICE

State law requires that all students have proper vaccinations, or they will not be allowed to enter or continue in school. Each student enrolled in the Mulvane Public Schools must file an immunization (KCI) form signed by a physician or local Health Department official. All students entering Mulvane Public Schools must have completed the full series of required immunizations and a health assessment form in order to enroll in school. Students who have not completed the required inoculations may enroll if a physician or local health department certifies that the child has received the most recent appropriate inoculation in the required series. The required series consists of:

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP): Five doses required. The Tdap booster is required at 11 years of age if more than 2 years since previous dose.
- Oral Polio (OPV): Four doses required. The last dose of the OPV inoculations must have been received after the fourth birthday.
- MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella): Two doses; state mandate requires student to have a total of two.
- A tetanus booster is required ten years after the last DPT.
- A Varicella (Chicken Pox) or proof of prior varicella disease must be provided.
- Hep B (Hepatitis B): Three doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs.
- PCV7 (Pneumococcal Conjugate): 4 doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs.
- Hep A (Hepatitis A): Two doses required for children less than 5 years of age in early childhood programs.

Medical or religious exemptions are the only legal alternatives allowed by the state and must be filed with the school annually.

Children who are exempt from immunizations will be excluded from school in the event of an outbreak or suspected case of vaccine preventable disease.

KIDCARE CONNECTIONS

Kid Care Connection is a state licensed child care service for school-age children - ages 5-12. Our mission is to provide quality and convenient childcare to your school-age children at a competitive value.

The fee for service is based on weekly contracts. Our license stipulates the number of children we can care for based on the size of the space, the site director's qualifications, and staff to child ratio. Consequently, we do not allow drop ins without prior arrangements to ensure license compliance. Our tuition schedule is as follows:

Mulvane residents can water lawns on days depending on your address.

Properties with even addresses: Monday & Thursday Properties with odd addresses: Tuesday & Friday

Water only from 6:00a.m.-9:00 a.m. OR 7:00 p.m.-10:00 pm

Lawn Watering Conservation Tips:

Experts estimate that 50 percent of the water we use outdoors goes to waste from evaporation or runoff due to overwatering. Step on it: Grass doesn't always need water just because its hot out. Step on the lawn, and if grass springs back, then it doesn't need water. An inexpensive soil moisture sensor can also show the amount of moisture at the plant's roots and discourage overwater-

Time is right: It's best to water lawns and landscapes in the early morning and late evening because significant amounts of water can be lost due to evaporation at other times of day. Check with your local utility to find out what times are best for your region.

Tune your system: Inspect irrigation systems and check for leaks and broken or clogged sprinkler heads. Fix sprinkler heads that are broken or spraying on the street or driveway.

Play zone defense: Assign areas of your landscape different zones depending on sun/shade exposure, soil and plant types, and type of sprinklers, and then adjust your irrigation systems or watering schedule based on those zones.

Give your hose a break: Sweep driveways, sidewalks, and steps rather than hosing them off. And don't forget to check for leaks at your spigot connection and tighten as necessary.

Leave it long: Raise your lawn mower blade. Longer grass promotes deeper root growth, resulting in a more drought resistant lawn, reduced evaporation, and fewer weeds.

City Utility Bills: Payment online now available. Go to the City website and click Online Payment on the sidebar. Payment is due by the 5th of each month in order to avoid the late penalty. Bills paid after the 5th are subject to a 5% penalty. Bills must be paid by the 19th of each month in order to avoid being disconnected. Please attach your utility bill stub to your payment to insure you receive proper credit to your bill. For after hours utility service, please call the Mulvane Police Dept. Dispatcher at 777-4262.
