Kindergarten and New Student Parent REMINDER!

- 1. State of Kansas requires immunization records on all new students and first time entry students prior to first day of school (including Pre-K and Kindergarten).
- 2. State of Kansas also requires a Health Assessment Form completed by your doctor for all first time entry students prior to first day of school.

Enrollment Reminders

- At the time of enrollment, take a copy of your child's immunization records to the school. Must be done prior to the first day of school.
- At the time of enrollment, take a copy of your child's health assessment form to the school. Must be done prior to the first day of school.

How do you know if your student is current, and if the school has what they need?

- Call your doctor to see if your child meets immunization requirements for their age.
- Call the school nurse to see if they have received your immunization and health assessment records.

Immunization Requirements for the 2017 - 2018 School Year

K.A.R. 28-1-20 defines immunizations required for any individual who attends school or a childcare program operated by a school. Below are the requirements for the indicated school year. Please carefully review the requirements. The usual number of doses required are listed; however there are exceptional circumstances that could alter the number of doses a child needs. If you have questions about your child's immunization status, contact your child's primary care provider or local health department.



Proof of receiving the required immunizations must be provided to the school prior to the student attending the first day of school.



MHS Summer School 2017

Mulvane High School will host Summer School this summer for students who need to make up credits. Classes offered will include English 1-4, math classes, history classes, and science classes. The dates of summer school are June 6 to June 23. All students will attend an orientation on Tuesday, June 6, and classes will begin on June 7. Attendance is required at all sessions.

Summer school hours are from 8:30 to 10:30 a.m. for one semester of English or social studies. The second session is from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. for one semester of math or science. Students who need a full credit will need to attend from 8:30 to 12:30 Mondays through Fridays. The fee for a .50 credit (1 semester) is \$150, and the fee for 1.0 credit (2 semesters) is \$230. The reduced fee for students who qualify for and receive free/reduced lunches is \$45 for a .50 credit and \$69 for 1.0 credit.

Parents of students who failed a first semester class will receive letters and summer school forms. These forms should be returned to MHS with payment. Students who fail a second semester class may contact the high school before the June 6 orientation day to sign up for summer school.

Students who do not complete summer school will have courses placed back into their schedules for the next school year. In some cases, this will require students to double up and take more than one year of a course at the same time. This also eliminates elective options as required courses must be included in schedules before electives are considered.
