2020 Competition Rules

- Open to high school students from Kansas' Fourth Congressional District.
- · Limit two submissions per student.
- Two-dimensional artwork that, when framed, will be no larger than 26" by 26" by 4" deep with a maximum weight of 15 pounds (including a frame which will be added to the winning piece)
- Work must be ready to hang. It does not have to be framed but should be frame-ready (e.g., matted).
- No glass is allowed.
- Artwork must be original in concept, design, and execution and may not violate U.S. copyright laws. Work cannot be copied from an existing photo or image that was created by someone other than the student. Work must be in its original medium and cannot be a scanned reproduction of a painting or drawing.
- Artwork that is potentially inappropriate for display in the Capitol will not be considered. This determination will be made by a panel. Exhibits depicting subjects of contemporary political controversy or a sensationalistic or gruesome nature will not be allowed.
- The winning entry will be framed and displayed in the U.S. Capitol complex in Washington D.C. for about one year and the winner will receive round-trip airfare tickets to attend a reception in D.C. Other prizes may be awarded.

Acceptable Mediums

- Paintings including oil, acrylics, & watercolor
- Drawings including pastels, colored pencil, pencil, charcoal, ink, & markers
- Collage must be two-dimensional
- Prints including lithographs, silkscreen, & block prints
- Mixed Media
- Computer Generated Art
- Photography
